Brighton Planning for the Future at King Edward Park

The Municipality of Brighton is creating a Master Plan to guide the future of the recreation and leisure facilities at King Edward Park on Elizabeth Street. The study will assess the property and facilities such as the arena, Community Centre, ball diamonds, skateboard park, playground equipment, curling rink, splash pad, and soccer fields to provide a strategy in preparation for future needs.

“The Municipality will be seeking input from the community during the planning process in order to receive feedback on the issues, trends, and future priorities at the park.” said Jim Millar, Director of Parks and Recreation. “The community’s opinions are very important as we plan for the future and so there will be opportunities for input at a Community Search Conference on September 20th as well as at a Public Open House in the fall.”
