

The Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton

By-Law No. 126-2016

Being a by-law to regulate and control vehicular parking on Municipal Property

Whereas, Section 11 (3) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O., c.25, as amended, provides that a Municipality may pass by-laws with respect to highways, including parking and traffic on highways;

And whereas, Section 102.1 (1) without limiting sections 9, 10, 11 of the Municipal Act 2001 S.O., c.25, as amended, a municipality may require a person to pay an administrative penalty if the municipality is satisfied that the person has failed to comply with any by-laws respecting the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles;

And whereas, Section 427 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O., 2001, c.25, as amended, provides in part that a by-law establishing a system of accessible parking shall provide that every person who contravenes the by-law is guilty of an offence;

And whereas, R.R.O., 1990, Regulation 581 under the Highway Traffic Act provides regulations for accessible parking for persons with disabilities;

And whereas, Section 428 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O., 2001, c.25, as amended, provides that a by-law may provide for offences for a vehicle parked in contravention of a by-law passed under this Act;

And whereas, Section 429 (1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O., 2001, c.25, as amended, provides that a municipality may establish a system of fines for offences under a by-law of the municipality passed under this Act;

And whereas, Section 432 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O., c.25, as amended, provides in part that a by-law related to parking, standing or stopping of vehicles, passed under Section 425 may establish a procedure for the voluntary payment of penalties out of court;

Now, therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton enacts as follows:

Section 1.0 Definitions

1.1 In this By-Law:

"Accessible Parking Permit" means a valid parking permit for a person with a disability as issued by the Ontario Ministry of Transportation or by another jurisdiction;

"Accessible Parking Sign" means a sign consisting of a "No Parking" symbol, the international symbol for accessibility (blue square overlaid in white with a stylized image of a person using a wheelchair) and the words "By Permit Only";

"ACCESSIBLE PARKING SPACE" means a parking space designated by pavement markings and authorized signs for the exclusive use of a motor vehicle displaying an Accessible Parking Permit in accordance with the requirements of the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. H.8 as amended, the regulations made thereunder and this By-law;

"Building" means a building as defined in the *Building Code Act, S.O.1992, Chapter 23*;

"Boulevard" means that portion of every street of the Municipality lying between the curb or edge of the travelled portion of the highway and the street line, exclusive of the area covered by any sidewalk and shall include any ornamental median strip of the Highway;

"By-Law Enforcement Officer" means a person appointed by the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this By-Law;

"Commercial Motor Vehicle" unless otherwise defined by regulation, means a motor vehicle having attached to it a truck or delivery body and includes an ambulance, a hearse, a casket wagon, a fire apparatus, a bus and a tractor used for hauling purposes on a highway;

"Corner" with reference to a highway intersection means the point of intersection of the prolongation of the lateral curb lines or in the absence of curb lines or curbs, the prolongation of the edges of the roadways;

"Crosswalk" means:

- i) that part of a highway at an intersection that is included within the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs, or in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway, or
- ii) any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by school crossing signs (as per the Ontario Traffic Manual – Book 5 Regulatory Signs) or by lines or other markings on the surface thereof, or
- iii) any part of the highway that is unmarked which is intended for pedestrians for crossing from sidewalk to sidewalk;

"Curbs" includes the edge of the travelled portion of a street or roadway;

"Cul-De-Sac" means a dead end street with only one inlet/outlet;

"Disability" means any person who has been deemed to be disabled by medical authority;

"Double Parking" as applied to a vehicle shall mean to allow that vehicle to remain stationary on the same side of the highway alongside and parallel with or nearly parallel to another vehicle already parked or standing or stopped at the curb of such highway except in obedience to traffic regulations, signs or signals;

"Driveway Access" means the portion of a street which is improved to permit the passage of vehicles between the adjacent roadway and the abutting property;

"Emergency Vehicle" means a police car, ambulance, fire truck or other vehicle responding to an emergency call pursuant to a statutory duty;

"Fire Chief" means the Chief of the Fire Department of the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton;

"Fire Department" means the Fire Department of the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton;

"Gross Weight" means the combined weight of vehicle and load;

"Heavy Truck" means a commercial vehicle having a weight of three (3) tonnes or more and shall include construction equipment, farm equipment, repair or towing

vehicles and recreation or camping vehicles, but does not include the following:

- i) any emergency vehicle;
- ii) any vehicle operated by or on behalf of the Municipality of Brighton,
- iii) any vehicle operated by or on behalf of a public utility commission or company,
- iv) any passenger vehicle,
- v) any school bus or transient bus which is in the course of transporting people.

"Highway" includes a common and public highway, lane, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, crescent, court, boulevard, way, place or bridge, or trestle designed and intended for use by the general public for passage of vehicles;

"Highway One-Way" means a highway upon which the movement of vehicle traffic is limited to one direction;

"Holiday" includes Sunday, New Year's Day, Family Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, Remembrance Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, the day proclaimed as the birthday or day fixed by proclamation of the sovereign and any day appointed by proclamation of the Governor General or for a general fast or thanksgiving and the next day when any such holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday;

"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways which join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other;

"King's Highway" means a highway so designated under the *Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act*;

"Loading Zone" means an area or place on a highway established by authority of this by-law for the accommodation of commercial vehicles for loading/unloading of goods;

"Motor Vehicle" includes an automobile, a motorcycle, a motor-assisted bicycle and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, but does not include a street car or other motor vehicle running only upon rails, a power-assisted bicycle, a motorized snow vehicle, a traction engine, a farm tractor, a self-propelled implement of husbandry or a road-building machine;

"Municipal Parking Lot" means a parking lot owned or operated by the Municipality under the provisions of this By-law;

"Municipality" means the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton;

"Official Sign" means any sign or roadway, curb or sidewalk marking or other device placed or erected under the authority of this by-law or any other by-law which is authorized pursuant to the *Highway Traffic Act* or the regulations passed thereunder, for the purpose of regulating, warning, parking or guiding traffic; in particular, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes yellow paint applied to a curb or object or pylons or temporary signs, placed to indicate that parking or stopping is prohibited;

"Operator" means any person who drives or operates or who has care and control of a vehicle upon a highway;

"Operations Supervisor" means the Public Works Operations Supervisor of the

Municipality of Brighton;

"Owner" when used in relation to property, means:

- i. the registered owner(s) of the property;
- ii. a person authorized in writing by the legal title holder of a vehicle to act on his or her behalf to enforce or to request the enforcement of this by-law;

"Park or Parking" when prohibited means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers;

"Parking Infraction" means any unlawful parking, standing or stopping of a vehicle that constitutes an offence;

"Parking Meter" means a device, sometimes referred to as an "individual parking meter", which indicates thereon the length of time during which a vehicle may be parked, which device has as a part thereof a receptacle for receiving payment and a slot or place in which payment may be deposited to activate a timing mechanism to indicate the passage of the interval of time following the deposit payment, the measurement of which interval is determined by the payment so deposited, and which device also displays a signal when the said interval of time has elapsed; and a device, sometimes referred to as a "pay and display parking meter", which dispenses a piece of paper intended to be removed from the device and displayed by the operator of a vehicle on the interior right-hand side of the front windshield of the vehicle when parked, the paper being imprinted with a time and date beyond which the vehicle may not be parked, and which device has as a part thereof a receptacle for the receiving of payment and a slot or place in which payment may be deposited to activate a mechanism to imprint a time and date on the piece of paper following the deposit of payment, the specific time and date being determined by the payment deposited;

"Permit" means a disabled person parking permit issued under the *Ontario Highway Traffic Act* or a permit, number plate or other marker or device issued by another jurisdiction and recognized under the *Act*;

"Person" means every natural person, firm, partnership, association or corporation;

"Police Officer" means a police officer as defined by the Police Services Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.15;

"Provincial Offences Act" means the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, R.S.O. CHAPTER P.33*, as amended,

"Roadway" means the part of the highway that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic but does not include the shoulder and where a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" refers to any one roadway separately and not to all of the roadway collectively;

"Set Fines" means that fine for parking infractions pursuant to the provisions of Part II of the *Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER P.33*, as amended, and as set out by the Chief Judge of the Provincial Court for the Province of Ontario;

"Shoulder" means the portion of the side of the roadway that is gravel or asphalt and within the Municipality;

"Sidewalk" means that portion of a highway that is improved, designed, constructed and ordinarily used exclusively for pedestrian traffic but does not include the shoulder;

"Sign or Sign Authorized" means any sign which is authorized pursuant to the *Ontario Highway Traffic Act* or the regulations passed thereunder or by the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton or an official designated by the Council to exercise its authority in this regard;

"Stop or Stopping" when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or of a traffic control or signal;

"Traffic" means any pedestrian, vehicles, street cars and any other conveyances either singly or together while using any highway for the purposes of travel;

"Traffic Control Devices" means any sign, roadway, curb or sidewalk marking or other device erected or placed under the authority of the Municipality for the purpose of guiding, directing, slowing or stopping traffic;

"Treasurer" means the Treasurer of the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton;

"Vehicle" includes a motor vehicle, trailer, traction engine, farm tractor, road-building machine, bicycle and vehicles drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power, but does not include a motorized snow vehicle, a street car or the cars of an electric or steam railway running only upon rails;

Section 2.0 Interpretation - General

2.1 This by-law applies only to all municipal streets, public lanes, municipal parking lots, and all other property owned, operated or occupied by the Municipality of Brighton,

2.2 This by-law does not apply to private parking lots,

2.3 Schedules referred to in this By-Law shall form a part of this By-Law and shall be of the same effect as if incorporated herein and each entry in a column of a Schedule shall be read in conjunction with the entries across therefrom, and not otherwise,

2.4 Imperial and metric measurements are provided in this bylaw. Metric will be the legal measurement.

Section 3.0 Parking Restrictions - General

3.1 No person shall park any vehicle on any street or highway within the Municipality of Brighton, other than on a one way street, unless:

- (a) that vehicle is parked on the right hand side of the street having regard for the direction in which the vehicle has been proceeding before it stopped; and
- (b) the right front and right rear wheels are parallel to the right hand curb or on a gravel or paved shoulder; and
- (c) the right front and right rear wheels are not more than 30 cm (12inches) from the edge of the roadway;

3.2 Where parking is permitted on a one way street, no person shall:

- (a) Park any vehicle unless that vehicle is facing in the same direction as is the traffic which is to travel on that street, and

- (b) Unless the left front and left rear wheels are parallel to and are not more than 30 cm (12 inches) from the edge of the roadway;

Section 4.0 Parking Spaces Identified By Lines

- 4.1** Where individual parking spaces are identified by lines, every vehicle shall be parked entirely within all of the lines which identify that individual parking space, and no person shall park a vehicle with its wheels across or outside the lines;
- 4.2** No person or persons shall park more than one (1) vehicle, or more than three (3) motorcycles or motor scooters, within an individual parking space that is identified by lines;

Section 5.0 Parking on Boulevards

- 5.1** No person shall park a vehicle on or over any boulevard used by or set aside for the use of pedestrians and forming part of any highway or being in or upon any park, parking lot, boulevard, garden or other place set aside for ornament or embellishment or for public recreation within the Municipality;

Section 6.0 Parking During Emergencies and Special Events

- 6.1** Notwithstanding any other provision of this By-Law to the contrary, in case of fire, a parade, an assembly of persons, a congestion of traffic, a construction project, or an emergency, parking may be restricted or prohibited at the discretion of the Director of Public Works and Development or his or her authorized representative.
- 6.2** Where parking has been restricted or prohibited pursuant to section 6.1, no person shall park a vehicle in contravention of such restrictions or prohibition. The declaration of an emergency and the parking restrictions or prohibitions related thereto shall be effected by systematic broadcast on local radio stations in the Municipality of Brighton and such broadcast shall be deemed to be sufficient notification of the restriction or prohibition then in effect.
- 6.3** For the purpose of this Section, "emergency" includes a snowfall or other acts of God, which hinders, restricts or prohibits movement of vehicles or pedestrians on a highway;

Section 7.0 Commercial Vehicle Loading Zones

- 7.1** No person shall park a motor vehicle in a marked and signed commercial loading zone unless;
 - (a) the vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle as defined under the Highway Traffic Act, and
 - (b) the commercial motor vehicle is loading or unloading goods related to a business in the Municipality of Brighton

Section 8.0 Parking Prohibited with Signs

- 8.1** Where signs prohibiting parking have been erected no person shall park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to remain parked on any highway:

- (a) on either side of a highway adjacent to a school or playground between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.;
- (b) within the turning basin of a cul-de-sac;
- (c) within 15 metres (49 feet) of the end of the roadway on a dead end highway;
- (d) in areas signed "No Parking" as outlined in Schedule "1";

Section 9.0 Parking Prohibitions

9.1 No person shall park a vehicle:

- (a) on or over a crosswalk, sidewalk or footpath;
- (b) in front of or within 2.5 metre (8 ft.) of a driveway or a laneway unless designated as a legal parking space;
- (c) within an intersection;
- (d) within 10 metres (33 ft.) of an intersecting roadway;
- (e) within 3 metres (10 ft.) of a fire hydrant;
- (f) within 9 metres (30 ft.) of a crosswalk;
- (g) in front of or within 8 metres (26 ft.) of a Fire Hall, on the side of a highway on which the Fire Hall is located;
- (h) on the opposite side of a highway on which a Fire Hall is located and within 30 metres (98 ft.) of the projected lot lines of the lot on which the Fire Hall is located.
- (i) on any street in such a manner so as to obstruct the free flow of traffic,
- (j) in such a manner as to prevent the convenient removal of any vehicle previously parked or left standing,
- (k) within 15 metres (49 ft.) of any level railway crossing,
- (l) alongside the tracks of any railway,
- (m) on or within 100 metres (328 ft.) of the approach to any bridge or in any tunnel or underpass;

9.2 No person shall park a heavy truck, as defined in this By-Law, in any Residential, Community Facility or Open Space zone as defined by the Municipality of Brighton Zoning By-Law, or in any Municipal Parking Lot,

9.3 Section 9.2 shall not apply to a heavy truck being used:

- (a) to make a delivery to, or pick up goods from, any premises within the above referenced zones, provided the truck is parked in such a manner as not to obstruct the normal flow of traffic, or;
- (b) in conjunction with a community festival or special event approved by the Municipality.

Section 10.0 **Highway Clearing And Cleaning**

- 10.1** No person shall park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to remain parked on any roadway or street or shoulder of the road within the Municipality:
- (a) in such a manner as to interfere with highway and/or street cleaning operations, or
 - (b) between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. from November 15th to March 15th

Section 11.0 **Accessible Parking Zones**

- 11.1** No person shall park a vehicle in any designated accessible parking space located on any street listed in Schedule "2", in any municipal parking lot or other municipal property that is identified by signage unless the driver or passenger has an accessible parking permit which is clearly visible to a Municipal By-law Enforcement Officer or Police Officer.

Section 12.0 **Maximum Parking Limit**

- 12.1** Where signage authorizes the parking of vehicles for specified periods of time, no person shall park any vehicle, heavy truck or commercial motor vehicle:
- (a) overnight from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. in any Municipal parking lot,
 - (b) for more than 2 hours in a 12 hour period in any defined parking area;
 - (c) for more than 3 hours in a 12 hour period in any Municipal parking lot;

Section 13.0 **School Bus Loading Zone**

- 13.1** No person shall park or stop a vehicle, other than a properly licensed school bus or a vehicle authorized by the School Board to transport students, in any school bus loading zone where signs prohibiting such parking or stopping have been erected.

Section 15.0 **Fee For Parking**

- 14.1** No person shall park a motor vehicle in an area designated in Schedule "3" to this By-law without first paying the fee set out in Schedule "3" and posted on site.
- 14.2** In parking lots where parking tickets are available from a machine designed for the purpose of issuing a parking permit in the form of a ticket, the operator of a motor vehicle shall obtain a ticket verifying the fee has been paid and display the said ticket in plain sight on the dash of the vehicle being parked.
- 14.3** Parking fees are payable Monday to Friday 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.; holidays and holidays that occur on a weekday are excluded.

Section 15.0 **Enforcement**

- 15.1** This By-Law applies to highways, streets, and property under the jurisdiction of the Corporation of the Municipality of Brighton.
- 15.2** A Police Officer or a Municipal By-Law Enforcement Officer shall enforce the provisions of this By-Law.
- 15.3** Every person who contravenes any provision of this By-Law is, upon conviction, guilty of an offence and shall be liable to such penalties prescribed by the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O., 1990, c.p.33,
- 15.4** Set fines for contravention of this by-law are set out in Schedule "5" of this By-law,
- 15.5** Notwithstanding any other provision of this By-Law, where a notice of violation of this By-law has been given to the owner or driver of a motor vehicle by means of a parking infraction notice, the defendant or their representative may, within seven (7) days after the time and date marked on such parking infraction notice, pay the lower amount of the set fine as indicated in Schedule "5" of this By-Law. Payment of the set fine may be made in person or by mail at the Municipality of Brighton's Municipal Office, P.O. Box 189, 35 Alice Street, Brighton, Ontario, K0K 1H0.
- 15.6** When tagging and towing of a vehicle is necessary to achieve compliance with this By-law, cost for tagging and towing the vehicle will be at the owner's expense.

Section 16.0 **Penalties**

- 16.1** Any person who violates any provision of this By-Law is, upon conviction, guilty of an offence and shall be liable to such penalties prescribed by the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O., 1990, Chapter P.33.,
- 16.2** All set fines for contravention of this By-law are listed in Schedule "6",
- 16.3** For the purposes of this By-Law, each day on which the offence occurs or continues shall be deemed to be a separate offence.

Section 17.0 **Validity**

In the event any Court of competent jurisdiction declares any section or any provision thereof of this By-Law to be invalid, or to be of no force and effect for any cause, such section or provision thereof shall be deemed severable from the remainder of the By-law and the remainder of the By-law shall stand and be enforceable to the same extent as if the offending section or provision thereof had not been included herein,

Section 18.0 **Repeal**

- 18.1** Parking Bylaw 1990-693 as amended is hereby repealed.

Section 19.0 **Date of Enactment**

- 19.1** This By-law shall come into force and take effect on the date of an order from the Ontario Court of Justice approving the set fines for the offences established by this By-Law.
